

Community Action Services

Community Action Services has been serving the low-income population since 1967. This organization is committed to developing solutions to poverty. It does this by fostering self-reliance in individuals, families, and communities. Community Action Services coordinates nine different programs to help sustain those who live in poverty. The organization is not about giving handouts but helping train the low-income population to sustain themselves. Some of their programs include The Employment/Education Program, which provides advocacy and goal setting counseling for families regarding employment and educational opportunities. Another educational service is their mentoring program, Project Vision—One-to-One Youth Mentor Program which matches volunteers with at risk youth one-on-one group activities. In these activities youth build a stronger self-image and contribute to the community.

Community Action Services also provides additional programs, which provide food and financial assistance to those in need. These services were created to fill in the gaps when individuals or families cannot meet ends financially. Under certain eligibility requirements, the program can assist in paying for rent deposits, medical prescriptions, utilities, gasoline, and bus tokens.

In order to apply for the services, the following forms should be brought: Social Security cards, proof of income, and information on monthly expenses. Also, to apply for any of the services the individuals or families must be in low-income bracket. They should additionally plan to meet with a caseworker to review their situation and to work on goals.

Poverty is a burden for everyone in the community. The Community Action Service is entirely devoted to helping alleviate this burden in our neighborhoods.
