STUDENTS

1.0 INTERNET/WIDE AREA NETWORK ACCEPTABLE USE

- 1.1 All use of the District Wide Area Network or Internet (both hereafter referred to as Internet) must be in support of public education and educational research.
  - 1.1.1 Any use of Internet for illegal or inappropriate purposes or to access materials that are objectionable in a public school environment, or in support of such activities, is prohibited. Language that is deemed to be vulgar is also prohibited.
    - 1.1.1.1 Illegal activities is defined as a violation of local, state, and/or federal laws. Objectionable is defined as materials that are identified as such by the rules and policies of the Utah State Board of Education that relate to curriculum materials and textbook adoption.
    - 1.1.1.2 Use of Internet to defame or demean any person is prohibited.
  - 1.1.2 Internet services provided by the school district are not intended for personal and private use.
- 1.2 Public school student use may be permitted provided the student receives written parental permission and proper supervision is maintained by school officials. Students shall not use the internet unsupervised.
- 1.3 No student is to be identified over Internet by full name, photograph, etc. without specific written permission from the parent or legal guardian. Additionally, private information covered under GRAMA and/or FERPA, such as home address, telephone number, etc., shall not be published over the internet without specific written parental permission.
- 1.4 Alpine School District shall maintain a filtered access point for the Internet. While the district provides a filtered access point to the Internet, sites accessible via the Internet may contain material that is illegal, defamatory, inaccurate or potentially offensive to some people. Users are expected to use appropriate judgment in selecting and viewing Internet sites.

1.5 Alpine School District shall be the final authority on use of the network and the issuance of public education user accounts.

1.5.1 Elementary students may have e-mail accounts.

1.5.1.1 The purpose of these e-mail accounts is to facilitate the elementary core technology requirement.

1.5.1.2 The e-mail accounts will be restricted to e-mail within the district.

1.5.2 Upon recommendation of school administration and permission of parents, secondary students may have personal electronic mail.

1.6 Appropriate disciplinary action shall be taken against any student who willfully and knowingly violates the Acceptable Use Policy.
